



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Message from the President



Dear fellow CAFS members,

It's my great honor to serve you as a president for CAFS in the year 2018-2019. We just finished a successful year of 2017-2018, thanks to the leadership of former president Jason Wan. The 2018 annual meeting and banquet was well done in Chicago. I appreciate the hard work of many CAFS members and student helpers, and the continuous support from former CAFS presidents who joined the annual banquet that had made it a successful event. The financial status of CAFS is very healthy, and maintains a strong balance sheet, which will allow us to do more work to contribute to the society and food community.

In 1975, CAFS was founded by a dozen of pioneers. With 43 years history, CAFS has grown up and become a mature society. CAFS-HAU Joint Symposium 2018

The International Forum on Food Science and Health (IFFSH2018) jointly hosted by the Chinese American Food Society (CAFS) and Hunan Agricultural University (HAU) was successfully held in Changsha, Hunan, China, on September 4 - 6, 2018. CAFS members Drs. Joseph Jen, Jason Wan, Howard Zhang, Hongda Chen, Juming Tang, Fanbin Kong, Guangwei Huang, Yanbin Li, Yen-Con Hung, and Zhaoming Xu were on the International Scientific Committee and invited speakers for the conference, and Dr. Zhongli Pan also served on the International Scientific Committee. Drs. Fangming Deng and Si Qin of HAU served on the International Scientific Committee, and were the leaders of the Local Organizing Committee, which was instrumental for the success of the conference. The conference focused on the theme of "Food Safety and Health, Innovation and Future Prospects", and served as a forum for scientists, technologists, researchers, students and entrepreneurs from all over the world, to discuss the latest development of food safety and health research, and the commercialization of new and emerging technologies in the industry. The conference featured 41 keynote and invited presentations from internationally renowned experts from USA, China, Canada, and Japan, and 41 poster presentations. This forum was participated by more than 300 representatives from 39 universities and institutions (26 from within China), and 18 food and allied-industry companies. Selected oral and poster presentations from the joint symposium are invited to develop into full-length papers for publication in a Special Issue of Food Control.

2018 Annual Banquet Report and Highlights

The 2018 Chinese American Food Society (CAFS) Annual Meeting and Banquet were held at the MingHin Cuisine Restaurant in Chicago, Illinois on July 16, 2018. Approximate 120 members and guests attended the meeting and banquet to network and share the latest news of the organization. This year's banquet marked the 43rd Anniversary of the Chinese American Food Society (CAFS) since its founding in 1975! We were honored that many VIPs and invited guests joined us for this special occasion, including Mr. Zhigang Lou, Vice President - China Dairy Industry Association (CDIA), Mr. Phillips Richard, General Manager - China Certification & Inspection (Group) Co. In his report, Dr. Wan highlighted the key activities and major

achievements of CAFS over the 2017/2018 year. Specifically, CAFS membership continued to grow. As the major organizer, CAFS joined with Hunan Agricultural University to host 2018 International Forum on Food Science & Health to be held in Changsha on September 3-5, 2018. It has been a great year for CAFS as there are two members who received IFT Fellow recognition -Dr. Yaguang Luo (former CAFS President and Research Food Technologist at USDA ARS Center in Beltsville, Maryland) and Dr. Zhou (Professor at Nanjing Guanghong Agricultural University and Director of the National Center of Meat Quality and Safety Control). Another two CAFS members also received the IFT Annual Achievement Awards – Dr. Zhongli Pan (former CAFS President and Adjunct Professor at UC Davis) joined his Innovative Infrared Research and Development Team in receiving the Research & Development Award, and Dr. Rui Hai Liu (Professor at Cornell University) is the recipient of Gilbert A. Leveille Award and Lectureship. Congratulations again to these four members!!



The CAFS Executive Committee continues to substantiate and deliver values to CAFS members, esp. by establishing a collection of CAFS historic newsletters and other materials, which allows the organization to keep track of

many initiatives and record major accomplishments over the years. 2018 CAFS Award Recipients

2018 PROFESSIONAL Award: Dr. Chengchu "Cathy" Liu



Dr. Catherine (Chengchu) Liu was a leading seafood scientist in China and now at the University of Maryland. She was professor and director of the Marine Bioresources Utilization Division at Shanghai Ocean University and provided leadership and management in the strategic, academic, intellectual, and administrative affairs of the Division. Her mission at the University of Maryland is to establish well-recognized citizen educational programs, provide leadership for clientele teaching, and conduct applied research to improve seafood safety and quality and reduce foodborne illness associated with seafood consumption. She has taught 1,500+ university students and provided HACCP and seafood safety training to 350+ industry and government professionals. She is the IFT Aquatic

Food Products Division incoming chair and serves on the National Seafood HACCP Alliance Steer Committee. She is an expert on Vibrio control in seafood. She has been an invited speaker in the USA, Singapore, Vietnam, China, Canada and Japan. She holds five patents, edited 1 and co-edited 7 books, published 22 book chapters and 76 peer-reviewed journal articles. She has numerous awards in teaching, research and outreach service. Dr. Liu is an exceptional and multi-talented accomplished scientist and scholar who has distinguished herself in advancing seafood science and safety.

2018 OUTSTANDING Student Award: Phoebe Chen, Xingyi Jiang



Phoebe Chen is a Ph.D. candidate in the Department of Food Science, UMass Amherst. Her research focuses on applications of drosophila melanogaster in nutraceutical research.



Xingyi Jiang is a Ph.D. student in the Department of Nutrition, Food & Exercise Sciences, Florida State University. Her research interests include food immunochemistry and food chemistry.

<u>Juming Tang Receives Innovation and</u> <u>Entrepreneurship Award</u>

Dr. Tang is the recipient of the Innovation and Entrepreneurship Award in 2018, Washington State University. Tang is the Distinguished Chair of Food Engineering. During his 22 years of research at WSU, he has yielded three U.S. patents and three pending patent applications. The FDA accepted three processes based on Dr. Tang's microwave technologies, paving the way to replace traditional canning methods. He has authored or co-authored more than 300 peerreviewed journal articles and three books. His research has appeared in publications including the New York Times, Fortune and Reuters. His awards include the R & D Award from the Institute of Food Technologists and International Food Engineering Award from the American Society of Agriculture and Biological Engineers.

<u>Yen-Con Hung Receives 2018 D.W. Brooks</u> <u>Faculty Award for Excellence in Global</u> <u>Programs</u>

Dr. Yen-Con Hung was the recipient of the 2018 D.W. Brooks Faculty Award for Excellence in Global programs, University of Georgia. Hung has helped to establish international cooperation agreements between the University of Georgia, the National Taiwan Ocean University, the National Pingtung University of Science and Technology, the Shanghai Academy of Agricultural Sciences, Shanghai Ocean University, Chiba University, and Kagoshima University. These partnerships have resulted in both research collaborations and the training of dozens of internationally minded graduate students who bring their new ideas and perspectives with them as they cross borders. In addition to his international outreach and education work, Hung, who joined the UGA Department of Food Science and Technology in

1985, has continued to pursue a robust and innovative research program, focusing on the engineering of food safety and the development of new products. He has published 150 refereed journal articles and five U.S. patents. Since 1986, Dr. Hung has received \$15 million in research funding from various funding agencies.

<u>Yao Olive Li Receives 2018 Teacher of the</u> <u>Year Award</u>

Dr. Yao Olive Li was selected for the Teacher of the Year Award in the Don B. Huntley College of Agriculture at Cal Poly Pomona, which is given to the instructor who demonstrates caring, the ability to manage the learning process, subject matter competence, zeal for teaching, scholarly writings, development of new curriculum or teaching materials or other contributions. Students lauded Li for her passion for teaching, seeking student feedback during the course, and giving specific examples of how course material is applied in real-world settings. "Dr. Li is a very passionate and capable professor, always trying to engage her students to see how she can change the curriculum and the teaching-learning style to benefit her students." "She is very caring, providing not only innumerable opportunities to her students, but also life and academic advice."

<u>Hongda Chen delivers plenary speech at</u> SNO 2018

Dr. Hongda Chen was invited to give plenary speech in 7th Sustainable Nanotechnology Organization (SNO) conference 2018, Nov. 8-10, Washington DC. Chen is the National Program Leader for Bioprocess Engineering and Nanotechnology at National Institute of Food and Agriculture (NIFA), USDA. He provides national leadership to develop nanoscale science, engineering, and technology for agriculture and food systems,

and provides national leadership in engineering approaches for research, development, education and extension in food quality, safety and nutritional value.

Currently, he directs Enhancing Food Safety through Improved Processing Technologies in the Food Safety Challenge programs; and Nanotechnology for Agriculture and Food

Systems in the Foundation programs of the Agriculture and Food Research Initiative (AFRI) – the flagship of NIFA's competitive grants program. Dr. Chen is an elected Fellow of Institute of Food Technologists (IFT), and a Fellow of International Academy of Food Science and Technology (IAFoST) of IUFoST.
