

MESSAGE FROM THE PAST PRESIDENT

Dear fellow CAFS members and friends,

It was truly a great honor and privilege to serve as the 2021-2022 CAFS President. As you know, this was the third year in a row of Covid-19 pandemic and the 3rd time in CAFS's 47-year history that we could not have a regular onsite Annual Banquet and Business Meeting. With the ending of the global pandemic, I feel very optimistic that we will resume our regular inperson Annual Meeting in Chicago next year. However, we were able to hold an online Annual Business Meeting on July 6, 2022. Thanks to the Executive Committee members and Committee Chairs as well as CAFS members and friends who have made this online Annual Business Meeting successful.

In the past year, CAFS has organized and co-led several activities. In March, CAFS and NACAN (North America Chinese Association for Nutrition) jointly held a webinar, entitled "Personalized Nutrition and Ultra-Processed Food". Three panelists from CAFS, Drs Catherine Liu, Shelly Xu and myself were invited and Dr. Olive Li served as the moderator. The webinar was held online and live broadcast worldwide. There were 100 participants on Zoom at its full capacity and more than 37,000 viewers on YouTube and other broadcast platforms at the same time. The Student Committee led by Xueqian Su, Dajun Yu and Chunya Tang successfully organized a Student Poster Competition. Seventeen graduate students from 10 universities participated the Competition. Nine judges from academia, industry and government voted in the first-round competition based on poster and abstract quality. Five finalists entered the second-round competition based on oral presentation. Four judges voted for the final winners. Students Ran Yang from the University of Tennessee, Zihan Wang and Xiaoyu Bao from the University of Alberta won the first, second and third Awards. Student Xueqian Su received Honorable mention.

I also want to thank the Membership Committee led by Dr. Jun Yang and Lihan Huang for



recruiting 4 Lifetime members and 10 Student members during such a difficult time. Welcome all new members to CAFS family! Thank Dr. Jun Yang for his continued effort in keeping CAFS membership directory up to date. The Bylaw Committee led by Dr. Fanbin Kong has successfully revised the CAFS Bylaw which clarified membership classifications, and the amendment has been approved by the Executive Committee. Many thanks to Ms. Li Zuo for compiling, editing and publishing 3 issues of CAFS newsletter in the past year. CAFS Website Chair Dr. Boce Zhang diligently worked behind the scenes to maintain and update our CAFS website contents. Our Treasurer Dr. Haiqiang Wang has kept our financial status updated. Juming Tang, Ph.D Member of US National Academy of Engineering



Dr. Juming Tang, Distinguished Chair of Food Engineering and Regents' Professor at Washington State University, was formally inducted on Oct. 2, 2022 as a member of the National Academy of Engineering (NAE) in Washington, D.C. Dr. Tang was selected to NAE in a 2021, the induction was postponed to 2022 due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Election to the National Academy of Engineering is among the highest professional distinctions accorded to an engineer in USA. Dr. Tang is recognized for his pioneering research in advancing thermal processing technologies for pathogen control in ready-to-eat food and low moisture foods. He is now among only three food engineers who are members of NAE. The other two are Dr. Paul Singh at UC Davis (2008) and Dr. Kenneth Swartzel at NC State University (2016).

In addition to over 400 peer-reviewed journal publications, Dr. Tang holds 14 US and international patents on microwave sterilization and pasteurization technologies. He was elected in 2022 as a Fellow of the US National Academy of Inventors.



Dr. Huang started with a remark to welcome the CAFS delegation, and he also provided a brief

history of the FST program (established in 1999), now an independent academic unit at NUS since 2029. He stressed that the department has received strong support from the University, and currently the department is looking for hiring multiple faculty from international applicants. <u>This link</u> leads to faculty positions currently open under 12 emerging areas at NUS.

During the event, the CAFS delegation provided information about the current status of food science research and education in the United States. Dr. Yao Olive Li presented a brief history, the mission and various activities of CAFS in support of the growth of food science professionals across several generations, and she invited the faculty and students at NUS to join CAFS. Dr. Luxin Wang presented the graduate programs at UC Davis and explained the application and admission processes. Dr. Cathy Liu and Dr. Keshun Liu presented their awardwinning research projects. The FST students at NUS were encouraged to connect to CAFS' Student Committee and they were invited to participate various competition events that will be hosted by CAFS student committee for the coming year of 2023.



It was a great event, and many thanks go to Dr. Hongshun Yang, who is in charge of the FST Department's graduate program at NUS. Dr. Yang has been also very active in various IFT events and activities, including currently serving as a Chair for Aquatic Food Products Division.
