Dear Members:

Our 1981 Annual Meeting was successfully held on the evening of June 8, at the Peng's Restaurant in Atlanta. As part of our tradition (not a very good one unfortunately), only 35 attendents pre-registered but more than 100 people showed up for dinner.

Under these circumstances, it is really very difficult for people in charge to arrange a Chinese style banquet. Even with a gusty commitment from our immediate past president, Santa Lin, by guaranteeing 8 tables and instantaneously adding 1 more, we were still short about 12 seats for the banquet. Most members, who were not seated at the banquet table, were kind enough to order their own meal and stayed on through the meeting. We would like to apologize to those people and express our appreciation for their understanding, cooperation and enthusiasm. Although there was a temporary confusion near the registration desk, we were very happy to see such a great turnout, particularly, to have 24 new members join our association; 22 guests from Taiwan joined our dinner.

During last year, under the direction of Santa Lin, our association made considerable progress. The ones most worth mentioning are as follows:

- A membership data file system is established.
- 2. Helped Taiwan's Ministry of Economic Affairs collect the data from our members, which enabled the Ministry to establish 104 computerized data of our member's expertise.
- 3. The quarterly newsletter is upgraded to contain some articles which are useful to some of our members.
- 4. A Chinese version of our association's by-law was published.
- 5. Collected suggestions from our members regarding Taiwan's Food R&D and food industry, regulation and safety. The reply from Taiwan was published in the last newsletter.

As a professional organization, we owe a lot to Santa Lin and his collegues in Ralston-Purina, such as Angel Yang, Honz-Ming Soo, David Chou and others who helped him. A great deal of personal time and effort was required to accomplish this.

OBJECTIVES 1.

a. Function

Broaden social function to social and technical function. Create meaningful activities for all members to get involved.

b. Consulting

Utilize the experience and expertise of all members to provide consultation and/or technical assistance to food industry in mother country.

2. ACTION PLAN AND TARGET

> Organize different committees, elect or appoint committee chairman who will select the committee members and coordinate committee activities.

Committee chairmanship shall be multi-year term so that continuity of activity can be ensured.

As you may not know, six committees were formed to better serve our society since the last IFT convention in Atlanta. Of particular interest are the consulting and educational committees which are responsible for providing technical assistance to our Motherland.

As Chairman of the Consulting Committee, I would like to acquaint you with the role of this committee within the society. The purpose of the Consulting Committee is to utilize our members' various expertise in solving technical problems for the food industry in the Mother Country. The major function of the Consulting Committee is to create opportunity for every available member for making significant contributions to the Chinese food industry and to be recognized by their expertise and reputation so that entrepreneurship would be possible. Dear Members:

July 16, 1981

As I reported in "the letter from president", six different committees have been organized to carry out the various activities planned for the coming years. Since fund raising committee is considered to be the least popular job, I have volunteered myself for this position.

Among the 4 possible sources of revenues i.e. (1) raising membership dues, (2) soliciting corporate membership, (3) soliciting advertisement for ACFSTA publication and (4) provide consultation and charge for the service, item #1 is of immediate concern to all of us.

According to the by laws, the menbership dues were <u>temporarily</u> set at \$2.00 for students and \$4.00 for professionals. These dues tend to be too low for a professional organization. In the past years, we were fortunate to have many members making generous contribution every year to prevent our organization from going red. Because of inflation and expanded activities and also because we believe the organization belongs to every one of us, the burden of carying the organization should be shared by all of us, it was proposed at the last Executive Committee meeting in Atlanta that the menbership dues be raised.

Since raising membership due would constitute an amendment to the by-laws, it will require a simple majority approval of the membership. A ballot regarding membership due adjustment is attached. please cast your vote and return it to me before August 15, 1981 so that new dues can be officially set and collection of dues can be started.

To help you making the decision, a budget for FY 81/82 is prepared and presented as follows;

According to our current record, we have 56 student members and 131 professional members. In the past, student membership due is half of the professional's. By using the same base, the professional membership due is calculated as follows:

$$2450.00/[131 + (56/2)] = 15.41$$

To meet our basic financial needs, the minimum due for professional shall be \$15.00 & \$7.50 for student. Of course the more active we are the more money will be spent. So please use the best of your judgement when you vote on this important subject.

Your cooperation will be most encouraging to the officers and will be greatly appreciated.
