Oscar Mayer Foods Corp. 是一家以生產肉類 80工品為主的公司, 其產品有三百种以上包括 hot dogs, luncheon meats, bacon, Louis Rich 失鷄 30工房,Claussen 酶小黄瓜和 foodservice items. Oscar Mayer有18個30工廠和40個経銷中少分佈全美,此外還有3個國外肉類加工廠(日本. 西班牙, 委內瑞拉). 在美國今內僱有員工14,000人,年銷售量約20億美元,該都設在Wisconsin卅百府 Madison,此世是加工廠,連続部僱用3,000人,1981年5月 Oscar Mayer & Co. 賣給 General Foods Corp. 政名為 Oscar Mayer Foods Corp.

公司起源

創始人 Oscar F. Mayer 在1873年 14歲,那時速自德國Bavaria未到美國 初期分别在 Detroit 和 Chicago 等地的店工作學習経為,於1883年和他以後,從德國来的夢冬 Gottfried 在Chicago 北邊合用一家零售房后,因為他的 Bavarian 对香腸廣气當地歡迎。五年發高店擴充,搬到兩條街以外一個較太的地方,1909年創始人的兒子 Oscar G. Mayer 自哈佛大學高學院畢業30入公司2年,公司大規模擴充,1919年起公司欠各為 Oscar Mayer & Co. 並且选擇在 Madison,WI 設廠。1950年公司將能部從Chicago 搬到 Madison。

公司分廠

Oscar Mayer有十一個 菌的的工廠在 Chicago, IL; Davenport, IA; Los Angeles, CA; Philadelphia, PA (專做 Wieners); Sherman, TX; Nashville, TN; Madison, WI; Coshocton, OH (專行 Davenport, PA); Columbia, MO (專做 Wieners 的新廠,明年同工);

Beardstown, IL (專管申務屠宰)和 perry, IA (專管內猪屠宰).

四個 Louis Rich 失題 內加工廠 座 落然 Modesto, CA; West Liberty, IA; Newberry, SC 和 Sigourney, IA.

兩個酶小黄瓜 80 I版 (Claussen pickle Co.)在 Woodstock, IL;

和 Fullerton, CA.

—個專管 foodservice 食粉的之廠(Prepared Foods of Sandusky) 在 Sandusky, OH.

三個在國外的富內加工廠是: Ven pack 在委內瑞花的 Caracas (89.3%股權), prima Meat packers 在日本東京等處有7個工廠(10%股權), Oscar Mayer, S.A. 在西班牙的 Valencia 等處 6個工廠(80.5%股權)。

產品銷售

一共有40個經銷中公和700位员工, "Oscar Mayer 電視廣告常 出现在下列節目: "Loveboat," "Benson," "Hart to Hart," "Believe It or Not," "Fall Guy," "Night Line," 和 Good Morning America." 新產品包括 90% fat-free cold cuts, Sodium reduced Tasty Light ham, Bacon-flavored cheese hot dog, Stuffin' Burgers, Enrobed Meals.

與其他大學一樣, Food Science & Nutrition 条館以 其不同Food Commodity 而散分數處,但以Eckles Hall 為田 館。条内教授約近20位,研究生約近50位,其中碩 士.博士班學生約各半。主要的Research範圍有肉類 加工(街品微生物,肉品加工),乳品加工(乳品微生物,酵 素應用,乳品加工),家禽類加工,蛋類加工(微生物,蛋之 化学, Microstructure研究), Corn 及 Soy bean 及其他穀類 之瞬時微生物研究, Food Flaver; Enzyme application, Trace-element 之分析 石开完, Sensory evaluation 及test, Nutrition, New product development Benergy usage, energy conservation 等方面之研究,其中以Food Microbiology 之教授碑容較為堅強。本系另一部分 Food Service management 在全美頗有名氣,但因本人平素沒接觸此 部分,所以無從簡介。設備則大部分頗齊、除各Food Commodity 之基本設備, pilot plant 外, 其他如 GC, HPLC, Computerized Instron, Insrafed oven, Rear oven, Freeze drier, Atomic absorption analyzer 等均有。

NEWS AND NOTES

- *The 1985 Symposium on Recent Advances in Food Science and Technology was held at the National Chung-Hsin University, Taiwan, on February 27-29. Six of our CAFS members gave talks on eight pre-selected topics. The Symposium was sponsored by the Food Industry Research and Development Coordinating Board, Republic of China, the Chinese Institute of Food Technologists, and CAFS. Approximately 180 individuals attended this Symposium.
- *The Second Chinese American Food Technologists Forum was held at Somerset Hilton, Somerset, New Jersey, on March 23. Mr. Shiu Lee of the Council of Agriculture, Republic of China, was the main speaker. The Forum was sponsored by the Advisory Committee to the Taiwan Food Industry, Ministry of Economic Affairs, Republic of China. Approximately 60 individuals attended this Forum.
- *Two Chinese American consulting teams will travel to China in the near future. These teams will address the topics of "Beverage Technology" and "Fruit and Vegetable Preservations."
- *The China National Food Industry Association, which has the responsibility to plan and oversee China's food industry development, is planning to establish a China Food University. This university will use creative and effective means to prepare technical people for China's food industry.
